

A Living Movement: Shaping a Just Future is the theme for the 2016 Gandhi-King Conference in Memphis, TN. This two day event brings together modern visionaries on nonviolence, justice and social change with community leaders, activists, academics, and organizers to train, learn, plan, and organize to shape a just future for all. Presentations and workshops should address racial, economic, environmental, and gender equality as they relate to historical and contemporary movements.

The 2016 conference will be held April 8-9, 2016 on the campus of the University of Memphis with a special dinner event at the National Civil Rights Museum on April 9, 2016.

DEADLINE FOR PROPOSALS is February 15, 2016. Notification of accepted proposals will be made by February 22, 2016.

SESSIONS: 75 Minutes

We encourage interactive workshops. Including, but not limited to:

Lecture/Panel: Didactic presentation, discussion limited to questions and answers. **Interactive/Experiential:** Involves presenter-directed verbal and/or physical participation.

Co-Creation: Participants and presenter create learning content together.

Presentations that incorporate stories, art, music, video, or photographic displays are especially encouraged.

PRESENTERS: Presentation proposals from professors, activists, community members, students and other interested parties are welcome. Presenters will be provided some space to exhibit books and other publications at the conference.

ACADEMIC TRACK: Panels, round-table discussions, and papers on the philosophy and theology of Gandhi and King, nonviolence and the arts, nonviolent theory, contemporary or historical case studies, and innovative ideas on shaping a just future for all.

ACTIVISM TRACK: Hands-on workshops, tools, techniques, and skill development in areas such as community building, nonviolent communication, sustainability, nonviolent education, economic, social, and environmental justice, et. al.

GENERAL TRACK: Themes and ideas not covered in Activism or Academia can be noted as a part of the general track.
